6/16/2022 - Minutes

1. CALL TO ORDER

Those present were: Chairman James Everett, along with Commissioners Jesse Crews, Drew Jones, and Luke Gowen; County Administrator Hampton Raulerson; County Clerk Jenifer Nobles; County Attorney John Adams; and visitors as recorded hereafter. Commissioner Benefield and HR Clerk Harden were absent.

2. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE TO THE FLAG

Chairman Everett led the Invocation and Pledge to the Flag.

3. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Commissioner Crews made motion to adopt the June 16, 2022 Agenda. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Jones, Board voted; motion carried unanimously.

4. ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Commissioner Gowen made motion to adopt the June 2, 2022 Minutes. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Jones, Board voted; motion carried unanimously.

5. FINANCIAL REPORT (SECOND MEETING)

Commissioner Gowen made motion to adopt the Financial Report. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Crews, Board voted; motion carried unanimously. Copy of Financial Report becomes integral part of Minutes.

Commissioner Crews made motion to adopt the Juneteenth Proclamation. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Gowen, Board voted; motion carried unanimously. Proclamation becomes integral part of Minutes.

7. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF CONTRACT #AAA-2023-21 - OPERATION OF SENIOR CENTER

Commissioner Crews made motion to approve Contract #AAA-2023-21 to Provide Operation of a Senior Center with Congregate and Home Delivered Meals. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Jones, Board voted; motion carried unanimously. The Board was notified that St. George services are available for congregate meals, interested parties may contact Connie Bass, Site Manager.

8. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF PETITION FOR SPEED BUMP - BOYD STREET

Commissioner Jones made motion to approve petition of county portion for speed bump on Boyd Street. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Gowen, Board voted; motion carried unanimously. Petition becomes integral part of Minutes.

9. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF VARIANCE REQUEST - HUNTER GOWEN

Commissioner Jones made motion to approve variance request for Hunter Gowen. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Crews, Board voted; motion carried unanimously. Variance request becomes integral part of Minutes.

10. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF SHELVING BIDS FOR STORAGE

After review of bids:

Global Industries \$11,992.39
Buy Rack \$6,829.07

Commissioner Gowen made motion to approve bid from Buy Rack for \$6,829.07 for shelving to be used for relocating storage records from the Sheriff's Office to an empty classroom at the EMS facility' shelving to be paid with 2020 Administration SPLOST funds. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Crews, Board voted; motion carried unanimously.

11. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REPAIRS FOR DUECE LLOYD SPORTS COMPLEX

After discussion of repairs for playground equipment at Deuce Lloyd Sports Complex, Commissioner Crews made motion to table repairs, so that Recreation Director Joel Shivar may contact Playworld to inspect equipment. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Gowen, Board voted; motion carried unanimously.

12. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO ORDER MOTOR GRADER

Ronnie Pollock and David Pinter, Yancey Brothers were present and discussed motor grader. Because of lead time for order of motor graders is close to 12 months, in order to replace the grader at the time of the buy back; Commissioner Gowen made motion to place order. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Jones, Board voted; motion carried unanimously. The Board discussed the possibility of not leasing, but sale or purchase at that time.

13. CONSIDER PURCHASE ORDER REQUEST FOR TEXTBOOKS - EMS

Commissioner Jones made motion to approve purchase order request for EMS textbooks. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Crews, Board voted; motion carried unanimously.
